Learning Task Instructions

1	<u>Exercise Track</u> Design your own exercise track in your yard and draw it on a piece of paper. Complete the exercise track timing yourself to see how long you take (if you don't have a timer, you can count as you go).
2	<u>Character Reflection</u> Write or draw how a character in your reader or a picture story book is feeling. What is making them feel this way?
3	<u>Place Value</u> Choose a one, two, three or four digit number. Show how many ways you can represent this number e.g breaking the number into thousands, hundreds, tens and one or drawing the appropriate MAB representations.
4	<u>Maths Games</u> Play any Maths Games you have at home (these can include any board games you have at home, <i>UNO</i> , playing cards for <i>Snap</i> or <i>Fish</i>).
5	<u>Ball Game</u> Throw a ball at a wall and catch it. How many times can you do this without dropping the ball?
6	<u>Narrative Writing</u> Find a comfortable spot without distractions and write a short narrative.
7	<u>Fitness Circuit</u> Write and complete your own fitness circuit. Select your own activities and repetitions, write them down and then complete. After completing the circuit write down how you feel and 3 changes you could make to the circuit.
8	<u>Backyard Blitz</u> Draw and label your ideal backyard.
9	<u>Mental Maths</u> Select any one or two digit numbers and create as many addition equations as you can.
10	<u>Design 3 new fonts</u> With each new font, write your full name and all of the letters of the alphabet (capital and lower case).
11	<u>TV Retell</u> Retell an episode of one of your favourite shows.
12	<u>Number Patterns</u> Write as many different number patterns as you can. You can start from any number and count forwards or backwards e.g count by 2's, 5s or 10.
13	<u>Jobs around the home</u> Write a list of 5 jobs that you can do around the home and then complete them. Select one of these jobs and write instructions to teach someone how to do it.
14	<u>Read and retell news</u> Read an article in the newspaper and tell someone about it. Answer 3 questions about the article or article topic.
15	<u>Story time</u> Select two short stories that you could read to someone or that someone could read to you. After reading or listening to the stories ask each other 3 questions about each story.
16	<u>Ball Game</u> Throw a ball in the air and catch it. How many times can you do this without dropping the ball? Can you clap between your throw and catch?
17	<u>Collecting and Sorting Treasure</u> Fill a container with 20 items from around the home or garden. Sort the items into groups and name each group. On a piece of paper write down each group and the name or picture of each item. Then return each item of treasure to the exact location you found it.
18	<u>Story Reflection</u> After reading your home reader or a picture story book write or say if you think your story was a good narrative? Justify your answer by saying which parts you did or didn't like.
19	<u>Counting Pegs</u> Count all the pegs at your clothesline and then make a graph showing the number of each type of peg.
20	<u>Descriptive Writing</u> Describe one of your toys. Can you use a colour, shape, size or texture word to describe what your toy looks like?
21	<u>TV Retell</u> Retell an episode of one of your favourite shows.
22	<u>Describing a Setting</u> Identify any descriptive words that were used in a picture story book or home reader that help to describe the setting. They might be colour, shape, size or texture words.
23	<u>Story time</u> Select two short stories that you could read to someone or that someone could read to you. After reading or listening to the stories ask each other 3 questions about each story.
24	<u>Ball Game</u> Throw a ball at a wall and catch it. How many times can you do this without dropping the ball?
25	<u>Family Interview</u> Prepare 10 questions to ask a family member that will help you to learn more about your family history. Interview a family member over the telephone or face to face. Write down each of your questions and their response to each question.
