Child Safety & Wellbeing Policy Consultation

The Child Safe Standards were first introduced in Victoria in January of 2016. There were seven standards that formed a mandatory framework aimed at protecting children from harm and abuse. Changes have now been made to ensure that the Standards are even stronger and hence protect children further. The seven standards have now increased to eleven standards and are in place from July 1st, this year. There is a stronger emphasis on involving families and communities in an organisation's efforts to keep children safe, a greater focus on safety for Aboriginal children, and managing the risk of child abuse in online environments.

Administration of Medication

If a student requires medication, Golden Square Primary School encourages parents to arrange for the medication to be taken outside of school hours. However, we understand that students may need to take medication at school or school activities. To support students to do so safely, Golden Square Primary School will follow the procedures set out in our <u>Administration of Medication Policy</u> which can be accessed on our <u>school website</u>.

Any medication brought to school by a student needs to be clearly labelled with:

- the student's name
- the dosage required
- the time the medication needs to be administered.

Parents/carers need to ensure that the medication a student has at school is within its expiry date. If school staff become aware that the medication a student has at school has expired, they will promptly contact the student's parents/carers who will need to arrange for medication within the expiry date to be provided.

Student Free Day - Berry Street Training

We are very excited to have been able to secure two training days this year in the Berry Street Educational Model training.

"The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) provides strategies for teaching and learning that enables teachers to increase engagement of students with complex, unmet learning needs and to successfully improve all students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement." Here is a <u>short clip</u> that will help us understand further, the impact that such learning can have on the outcomes of all students in the school. The Mental Health Menu funding that we are receiving this year will finance our involvement in this <u>Berry Street Education Model</u> learning.

The first day training is scheduled for Monday 20th June. The second day training is scheduled for Monday 24th October. Two further days training will be held in 2023.

As the training will involve all staff and the training is being delivered off-site, the school will be closed on this day. Please make bookings with Camp Australia for their services if supervision and care of your child/ren is required.

COVID-19 Update

There have been a few questions from families around matters relating to COVID-19. We will attempt to answer a couple of the frequently asked questions for you, however, please be mindful that these guidelines continue to change.

My child is a household contact. What does that mean?

You are classified as a household contact if you have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation, or care facility.

Children who are household contacts no longer need to isolate as long as they take additional safety measures. These measures include:

- Notifying the school that they are a household contact.
- Undertake daily rapid antigen testing five times within the 7 days.
- Wear a face covering when indoors if aged 8-years and above or unless they have a valid exemption.

There is a <u>checklist for COVID contacts</u> that provides further information.

We have received another delivery of rapid antigen tests and will distribute these shortly. A Compass message will alert you to when this has happened so you know to look out for these in your children's bags. If your child is required to undertake additional testing because they are a household contact and you do not have enough rapid antigen tests available for them, please contact us and if we have supplies available, we will provide them with a pack.

My child has tested positive for COVID-19. What do I need to do now?

If your child tests positive for COVID-19 the following must occur.

- Isolate at home or in private accommodation for 7 days (inclusive of weekends) and not attend school during this period of time.
- Report the result to the Department of Health online or call 1800 675 398.
- Inform the school that they have tested positive to COVID-19.
- Follow the <u>checklist for COVID cases.</u>

2022 Student Attitudes to School Survey

Dear Parent / Caregiver / Guardian,

This letter is to inform you about the 2022 Student Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS), that your child is invited to participate in.

About the survey

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of your school.

The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist your child's school to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer and family relationships, resilience, bullying, mental health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

This year, the AtoSS will be conducted at your school over the period <u>Monday 30 May – Friday 17 June</u> 2022.

What are the benefits?

In our experience, young people enjoy having their say. We have been running this survey for nearly 20 years and it has been invaluable in helping schools understand student views. Your school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

What are the risks?

While we do not anticipate many risks of participation, some students may find some of the survey questions too personal and sensitive in nature. Should you agree for your child to participate, they are still free to skip questions or to withdraw at any stage if the survey makes them upset or uncomfortable.

The survey has been approved by a Human Research Ethics Committee. The questions are selected from validated survey instruments used in Australia and around the world, are strength-based, and tailored for each year level group.

What will my child be asked to do?

Your child will be invited to complete the survey online during class time using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Please note:

- Student participation in the survey is voluntary and students may withdraw at any time.
- The survey will take around 20-45 minutes to complete.

How is my child's confidentiality protected?

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey from their teacher. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. Personally identifiable data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

How will results be reported?

The survey results will be reported back to the school in an aggregate form throughout the survey period. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no

individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

Your school may share the results of the survey with parents, in documents such as the School Annual Report.

Options for participation

Participation in this survey is voluntary. If you do not wish for your child to do the survey, please opt out via email to your school: <u>golden.square.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u>. Please do so before <u>Monday 30</u> <u>May 2022</u> stating that you wish to opt out of your child's participation, along with their name and year level.

If your school does not receive a Refusal of Consent email from yourself before the survey commencement date mentioned within this letter, it means that you give your consent for your child to participate in the 2022 Attitudes to School Survey.

A copy of the survey that we are asking your child to complete is available from your child's school. Please contact the administration office if you would like to see the survey before making your decision about whether you would like your child to participate.
