Reading and Writing

We are having our final week on poetry. Students have been able to identify and explain whether a text has any elements of poetry (rhyme, repetition, imagery, alliteration and onomatopoeia), using examples from the book to help.

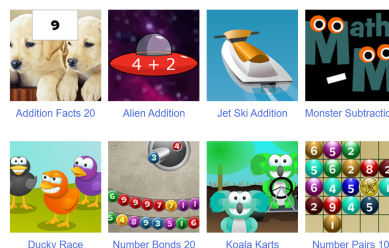
In writing, students have been planning a story to turn into a comic strip, including the things we have learnt about in our poetry unit. Students have loved showing onomatopoeia in their stories, ready to draw them later this week.



Next term we'll be focussing on persuasive and narrative.

Mathematics

Students have been revising previous topics in maths, including addition, subtraction and data collection and representation. We have played many games and will be creating our own question to collect data for.



Next term we'll be focussing on multiplication, division and units of measure.

Integrated / Phys Ed

During Integrated lessons, students were able to compare two different animals, explaining the similarities and differences between a fictional and non-fictional animal. Students looked at the adaptations we have explored this term, identifying different living conditions and their physical appearance.

This week we are having a focus on AFL ready for Footy Colours Day on Friday. Students will be learning the correct way to kick and handball a footy. We also have our last SEDA session tomorrow that will bring together a lot of different skills.

Reminders

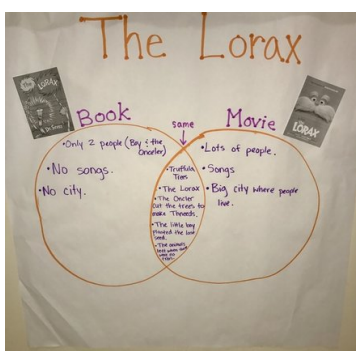

Please remember to label all jackets and jumpers as we have a large pile of unnamed clothing in the 1/2 area.

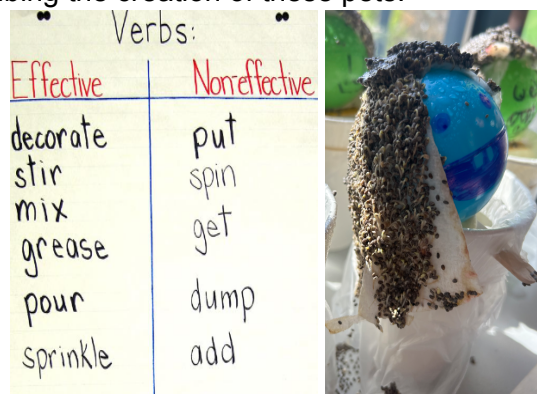
Reading and Writing

In our Reading classes, we wrapped up our journey through Dr. Seuss's "The Lorax." The students enjoyed the rhyme and flow of the text. During these sessions, our students focused on the book's important themes of sustainability and environmental awareness. To add an extra layer of engagement, they also compared the book to its movie adaptation, using a Venn diagram to highlight the similarities and differences.



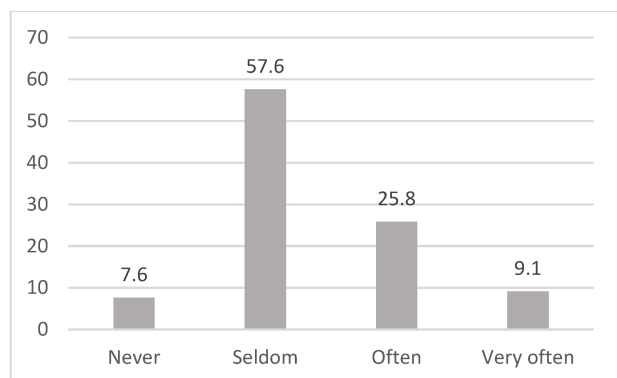
Our Precious Water Incursion

In Writing, the students have been practising developing procedural texts. They have explored what makes an engaging procedure and the use of effective verbs for procedure writing. The 'Chia Heads' continue to progress and students created procedures describing the creation of these pets.



Maths

We have been studying the collection, display and analysis of data in our classes this week. Students have conducted surveys within their classes to identify the number of sustainable practices used by their peers. Students then graphed and analysed this data. Some students even got to graph their results in Excel.

Students going on camp have completed their cabin wish list allocations. Students will find out their cabin buddies on day one of camp.

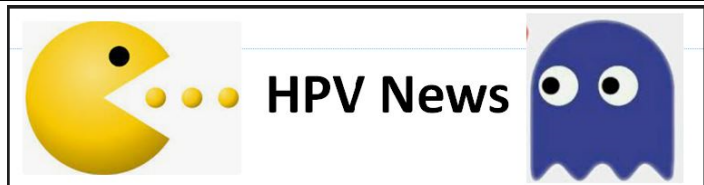
Thank you to parents who have completed payments at the school office. Consent and payment is now due.

2023 Chinese Language Participation Weeks

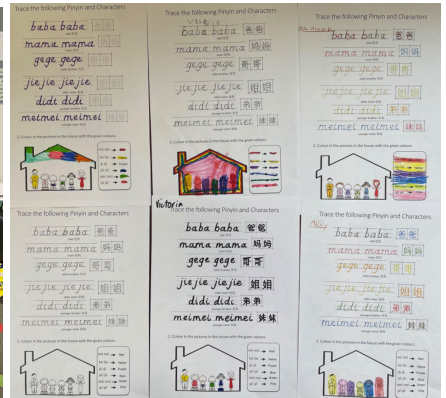
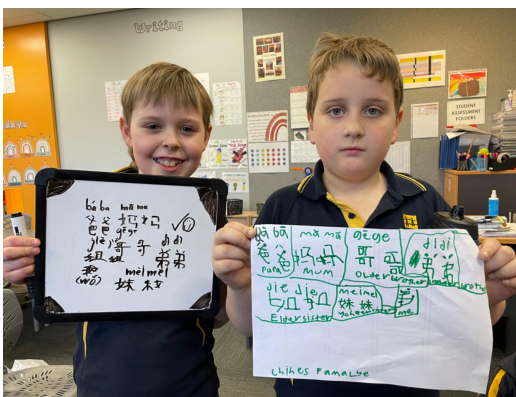

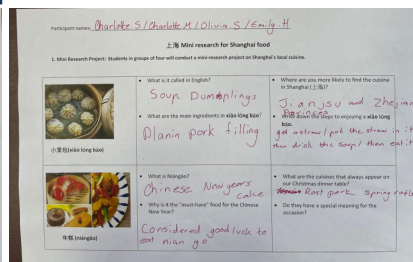
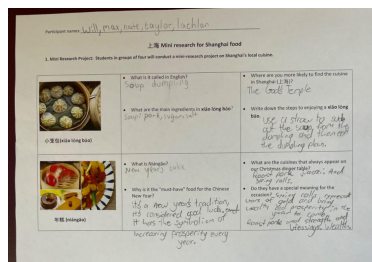
Foundation - Grade 4
