COVIDSAFE Measures Extension

I would like to thank parents, carers, students and staff for the great job they have been doing, keeping our school as safe as possible by following important COVIDSafe measures such as mask wearing, physical distancing, ventilation and rapid antigen testing. This has meant that our school has remained open and our students in class. This is a fantastic outcome. To keep schools as safe as possible, the Victorian Government has extended the COVIDSafe measures introduced for the beginning of Term 1. This includes extending the availability of free rapid antigen tests (RAT) for screening until the end of term.

Parking Services - City of Greater Bendigo (Repeat Notice)

Parking Services from the City of Greater Bendigo have contacted our school and requested that the following information be conveyed to our school community.

The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school poses a safety concern to children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school.

Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, on nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park. A number of schools have short term time restricted areas, such as 2 minute pick up drop off. These parking areas are in place to allow for ease of access close to schools and these restrictions must be adhered to. Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.

With regard to children's crossings, the law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary, stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.

City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police do conduct random patrols throughout the school year at various locations to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules.

Face Masks (Repeat Notice)

Your support in sending your child to school with their own mask each day will be greatly appreciated. A face mask must be well fitted and cover the nose and mouth. Please visit coronavirus.vic.gov.au for the latest face mask requirements.

- Children in Grade 3 and above must wear a face mask indoors at school unless a lawful exception applies. The wearing of masks must still occur even if the child is vaccinated.
- Children in Prep to Grade 2 are strongly recommended to wear a face mask indoors at school.
- Children do not need to wear the mask outdoors.
- All visitors to school must wear face masks when indoors unless there is a lawful exception.

Rapid Antigen Tests (Repeat Notice)

Free rapid antigen tests have been made available for all students in our school for the first four weeks of Term 1, 2022. One package, which contains five tests, had been handed to families at the beginning of this term (one packet per child). A second package is in the process of being distributed this week. If you have not collected your second package, please come into the office at a time that is convenient for you.

- Testing is to occur at home.
- It is recommended that testing occurs twice a week.
- Positive tests must be reported to the school **and** to the Department of Health either <u>online</u> or by telephone on 1800 675 398.

Home Learning Program (Repeat Notice)

Students who are required to isolate or quarantine will be supported in the same way as students with an attended absence due to illness or injury, with learning materials provided to support their continued learning. We will not be providing a full remote learning program in these circumstances. To ensure that all students are supported to remain learning, we have developed a grid of home learning tasks that students will complete when absent. Writing

Students are enjoying Shared Reading sessions where they have the opportunity to read along with the teacher and explore new vocabulary. They have continued to work on their reading skills learning to match spoken word to written words and follow along when reading with their fingers. They are also developing independence to make the first sound of a word with their mouth and recognise sight words in books. Students are learning to make predictions using pictures on the front cover along with the book title before they read and to retell the story after



Mathematics

This week students have continued to explore their understanding of numbers. They have learnt to count with one to one matching and explored the language of one more (before) and one less (after) and choosing a group with the most.

Students have explored counting on tens frames and counting collections of items and writing the digit and amount of dots to match.





Students are continuing to strengthen their fine motor skills to establish correct writing habits. Students have spent time learning correct letter formations and pencil grip as well as writing sight words and simple words using letters/sounds taught. They have also copied and written sentences about their weekend and are working hard to only use a capital letter at the beginning of their name followed by lowercase letters. When writing, students are learning to use lower case letters and ensure there are spaces between each word.

Grade 3 & 4 - Ashlie McKenzie

Reading

In reading we have continued to develop a community of readers within our classrooms.

The students have explored 'their rights as a reader' and are working to model those behaviours while extending their reading stamina during reading sessions. In 3/4MC we have been reading 'Cloudy with a chance of meatballs' as a class and using our senses to visualise what it would be like to live in the town of Chewandswallow.



Mathematics

In numeracy sessions we have continued to consolidate our understanding of place value. Students have practiced making, ordering, writing and saying numbers up to the 10,000's.

Students have also begun practicing mapping out familiar locations such as our school. They have explored features of mapping such as keys, scales and compass points.



Writing

In writing this week we have been looking at narrative writing. The students have been focussing on planning out their writing following the 'mountain structure' so that their stories have a climax of a problem which needs to be overcome and the resolution to the problem at the end. The students have also been working on being authors 'show' rather than 'tell' when creating these narrative pieces.

Grade 5 & 6

Reading

In reading the Grade 5-6 students have been reading Myths and Legends. In doing so they have been able to identify the differences between Myths and Legends as well as looking at the messages these texts provide. Along with this, the students have worked at identifying the intended audience of the different Myths and Legends and giving their reasons why they chose this audience. The students are now moving on to gaining a deeper understanding of the characters in texts.

Mathematics

The students have been focusing on data collection, representation and interpretation. They have looked at various ways to display data and have started interpreting side by side column graphs. Some of the data they have been collecting came in the form of measuring the distance they could throw their paper airplanes. From this they created graphs to show their results.





Writing

The students have been looking at narrative texts in writing. They have explored the structure of a narrative as well as revising the way they use nouns, verbs and adjectives to improve the quality of their texts. As well as this the students have been looking at describing the setting in their introductions.

Grade 1 & 2

Grade 1/2s have been watching and discussing some videos on cybersafety and why it's important to keep our personal information safe. They have also been having fun with some literacy and numeracy activities and show they have a bit more experience logging into the computers and navigating than the Preps. Grade 5 & 6

Grade 5/6s have enjoyed starting the year creating pixel art pictures using Microsoft Excel. Some of them have been quite complicated and are looking great. They then list some of the grid references and colours used to see that every box (cell) has a different reference. Later in the year, we will look at using some simple formulas in Excel. This week is our first lesson on our Google Education Apps. Students have been uploading their completed work to Google Classroom. We will also upskill in Google Drive and Google Docs. Other class projects coming up in 2022 include robotics activities, claymation filmmaking (move over Wallace & Gromit) and 3D printing.



Prep

The Preps have been doing really well with their first computer lessons. Many of them have not used a mouse before and once they press the screen they find out it's not a touch screen! I've put a yellow dot on the left mouse button so they can see where they need to click. They have been doing really well with our literacy and numeracy activities as they develop their hand-eye coordination to point and click in the right spot! We have also had some big helpers from Grades 3/4 and 5/6. If you want to see some of our activities, have a look at **mrsuter.com**.



Grade 3 & 4

Grade 3/4s have been showing their creativity by using the drawing tools in Microsoft Word with our 'House on a Hill' project. They have been learning how to insert, colour, resize and rearrange different shapes to create a picture. This week is our first lesson on our Google Education Apps. Students have been uploading their completed work to Google Classroom. In the coming weeks, we will also look over Gmail and proper email etiquette, as well as how to use Google Drive and Google Docs. We will also be doing some 3D design and printing, and (the ever popular) Minecraft Education in 2022.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

EDUCATIO

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or nongovernment Victorian primary or secondary school must:

on the first day of Term one, or;

- on the first day of Term two.
- Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 28 January 2021, 14 April 2020 or 5 October 2020.

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$62.50 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$112.50 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2020 closes on 27 November

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years. Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.
