### **Building Works Update**

It is exciting to have the fence removed from the front of the Prep/1 building and the new deck being unveiled. The comments have been positive and the rain has fallen at a time that has enabled us to check the grip. There is a definite difference and it is great to know that everyone's safety has been improved.

The fence has now moved down to the Grade 2 area where the work will be duplicated.

For those that are using before and after school care this week, you will also notice that the front entrance to the gym is fenced off. This is due to replacing weathered materials on the facade of this building. You are able to enter the foyer of the gym by turning the corner at the 2/3 playground and turf where you will see a side door. This fencing is planned to only be there this week and then return again during the school holidays.

#### **New Readers**

The Department released a statement in the latter part of 2024 in relation to the teaching of reading in the early years of school. There is an expectation that all Victorian government primary schools will adopt this new position with full implementation in 2027.

Our teachers have fully embraced the new approach and are working hard to implement the explicit teaching of phonics everyday for a minimum of 25 minutes. This is one part of the reading position. The teachers are planning together and have been so supportive of each other whilst at all times wanting the very best for every child.

As part of the change to the approach being taken, we have been able to purchase new readers that are supportive of the teaching and learning that is occurring. Our School Council members considered this need when creating and endorsing the annual school budget. We thank our teachers for their hard work and the School Council members for being supportive of ensuring that the resources are available.

#### **Prep to Grade 2 Gym Program**

Families would have received a Compass notification advising them of the opportunity for the children to participate in a gymnastics program from the start of next term. The program is run by instructors at Jets Gymnastics which is located at the old Golden Square Secondary College site. Their teachers will attend with them.

This program is a wonderful way for the children to join in activities that challenge and grow their sense of self-confidence in a safe environment. It does include a bus ride and for many of our youngest children, this is just as exciting as the gym experience itself.

Please take the time to provide your permission for your child to attend on Compass noting that CSEF and School Saving Bonus money can be used to cover the cost of this activity if it is available to you. If you are uncertain, please contact the office.

#### **School Wide Positive Behaviour Support**

School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is a school improvement framework that is helping us create a positive and supportive learning environment. It improves student behaviour, wellbeing, and academic outcomes by focusing on prevention and making the best use of school resources.

The goals of SWPBS are:

- Support the social, emotional, and behavioural needs of all students, including those with challenging behaviours, through instructions and environmental supports.
- Provide a clear structure for using evidence-based practices that benefit every student.
- Use data to guide decisions and improve support.
- Help staff develop confidence and skills in evidence-based practices.

An evidence-based, multi-tiered approach ensures we can meet students' social (how we interact), emotional (how we feel), and behavioural (how we act) needs. This in turn assists us in providing a safe, kind and respectful environment that inspires a passion and curiosity for learning.

#### **School Photo Day**

You will notice a flyer in this newsletter providing you with some information around how to order your child's school photos. Photo Day is on the 5th August so book in the haircuts, be ready to wash the vegemite off the faces in the morning, and hope that the wobbly front tooth doesn't choose that day to fall out - although that is a magical milestone that would be captured.

#### **Learning Conversations**

Another reminder that you are now able to book times to hold Learning Conversations with your child's teacher on Compass. It is a great opportunity to talk with the teacher about your child's reports. The reports show how your child is progressing with their learning and the work habits they display on a regular basis. Please bring your child with you to be part of the conversation.

If you are making a booking with a specialist teacher, may you please only make the one booking even if you have more than one child attending our school. This will ensure that more families have the opportunity to meet with them.

## **School Savings Bonus Update**

Families can continue to use SSB funds until **Monday 30 June 2025** to buy textbooks or uniforms, or to allocate funds to school activities using the parent/carer online system.

The parent/carer online system will close at <u>11:59 pm on 30 June 2025</u>. Any unused online supplier vouchers will expire, and all unspent SSB funds will revert to a school activities credit held against the family account for each student. These balances are expected to be back onto school accounts by the end of August 2025.

Please note, the dedicated SSB phone support for families will end 3 weeks into Term 3 (Friday 8 August 2025), while email support will continue until the end of 2025.


