Cooler Weather and Winter Uniform

The weather has certainly become cooler and we have noticed that there are children coming to the office asking for jumpers as they are cold. We are happy to provide what we have to the children, however, we really do not have a lot on hand.

If you have a jumper or jacket at home for your child, may you please support them in wearing it to school. Having them named means that if they take them off and forget to pop it in their bag, we can return it to them.

If last year's jacket or jumper is too small this year, you can bring it into the school for us to wash and have ready for another family to use. You may also find another jumper on the rack that is the perfect size for your child. Please note that we are only accepting items that have our school logo on them e.g. shirts, jumpers and jackets.

This uniform exchange is a wonderful initiative that was introduced by our School Council with the vision of our community supporting each other and reducing waste.

If there is not a piece of clothing in the right size, there are a couple of options for you. You can nominate to use your child's School Saving Bonus to purchase uniform, or, if there has already been spent, we can support through State Schools Relief. Please don't hesitate to contact us.

Building Works

Last week it was mentioned that there will be some building works at the school. This may be starting as early as next week. National Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation date is held from the 27th May to 3rd June each year. These eight days include the 1967 Australian Referendum date (27th May, 1967) and The Mabo High Court decision (3rd June, 1992).

The 1967 Australian Referendum was when Australians voted to change the Constitution so that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples would be counted as part of the population.

The Mabo HIgh Court Decision recognised the land rights of the Meriam people as the traditional owners of the Murray Islands. Twelve months later, the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth) was passed.

- 4. The books are delivered back to your child's classroom where the teacher will hand them out to very excited students!


